We have U.S. cokemaking facilities in Virginia, Indiana, Ohio and Illinois, and international operations in Vitória, Brazil. Additionally, we operate four logistics terminals in the U.S. that process raw materials and act as intermediaries between our customers and end users for both the U.S. and global export markets.

We are a leading provider of coal handling services in the Ohio River Valley Basin and Gulf Coast region with more than 30 years of experience receiving, blending, storing, and transloading thermal and metallurgical coals.
