

Supplier and Vendor Code of Conduct

SunCoke is committed to operating its business in and ethical and responsible manner and partnering with suppliers and vendors to develop sustainability performance in its supply chain. We expect our suppliers and vendors to adhere to recognized environmental, social and corporate governance ("ESG") standards and use best efforts to implement such standards with their suppliers and subcontractors.

Ethics & Integrity

SunCoke expects its suppliers and vendors to:

- maintain accurate books and records in compliance with applicable laws, regulations, contractual obligations and accounting standards;
- comply with applicable national and international trade laws and regulations, and:
 - avoid agreements or actions that illegally restrain trade, restrict competition, or otherwise violate antitrust and competition laws;
 - prohibit transactions with individuals, entities, or countries subject to restricted party or embargoed country lists;
 - forbid gifts to private or public officials to influence business decisions or otherwise encourage them to act contrary to the obligations of their office;
 - prohibit bribery, corruption, money laundering, or other fraudulent business practices;
- avoid interactions with SunCoke employees that may conflict, or appear to conflict, with that employee's acting in the best interest of SunCoke:
- ensure compliance with laws and directives relating to the protection, transfer, access, and storage of personal information; and
- protect SunCoke's confidential information and intellectual property to prevent misuse (including possible insider trading), theft, or improper disclosure.

Environment, Health & Safety

SunCoke expects its suppliers and vendors to comply with applicable environmental, health and safety regulations, including those relating to hazardous materials, raw materials, wastewater, and solid waste and air emissions. SunCoke's suppliers and vendors must aim to reduce the environmental impact of their business operations and promote the sustainability of natural resources.

SunCoke expects its suppliers and vendors to: (i) comply with applicable occupational health and safety laws and regulations; (ii) create a safe workplace for their employees; and (iii) use appropriate management systems designed to ensure compliance with applicable safety requirements,

Social Matters & Human Rights

SunCoke expects its suppliers and vendors to:

- protect the human rights of their employees and not use forced, involuntary, or compulsory labor (including prison labor, indentured labor, bonded labor, or slave labor);
- comply with applicable laws and regulations governing wages, benefits and working hours, including child labor laws;
- respect their employees, treat them fairly and promote a work environment that is free from unlawful harassment, harsh or inhumane treatment, discrimination, violence and threats of violence, or coercion;
- uphold their employees' rights to freedom of association and collective bargaining in accordance with applicable laws;
- enable their employees and other stakeholders to report concerns or potentially unlawful practices at the workplace through a transparent, responsive, anonymous, unbiased, and confidential complaints mechanism through which they can report violations of supplier policies, expectations contained in this Supplier and Vendor Code of Conduct, other workplace grievances, or legal or ethical violations
- that products supplied to SunCoke do not contain materials derived from minerals originated from conflict regions that finance or benefit armed groups. SunCoke expects its suppliers and vendors to provide all necessary information to facilitate reasonable country of origin inquiries and due diligence.

Ensuring the principles of sustainable development in our supply chain is important to SunCoke. Our suppliers and vendors should implement an appropriate compliance management system to facilitate compliance with applicable laws, regulations, and standards. SunCoke reserves the right to conduct audits or assessments to monitor compliance with this Supplier and Vendor Code of Conduct and if SunCoke becomes aware of a potential breach of the Supplier and Vendor Code of Conduct or its policies, SunCoke works to investigate and remedy such breach. If any such remedy is ineffective, or if a supplier or vendor displays a pattern of noncompliance, SunCoke reserves the right to discontinue its relationship with any supplier or vendor.
